### Plasfic Free Lunch Day USA

Join us, Nov 2, 2022!

Join Cafeteria Culture, SDUSD, and schools around the country to celebrate Plastic Free Lunch Day at your school on **Wednesday, November 2.** 

<u>Plastic Free Lunch Day</u> is a day to encourage the elimination of single-use plastics during lunch (or use as few as possible) in both lunches served at school and lunches brought from home. It's an opportunity to try new ways of doing things.

### Why Plastic Free Lunch Day?

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- School cafeterias serve over 7 billion meals per year
- School meals are loaded with single-use plastics
- . Less than 9% of plastic is recycled
- . Most plastic ends up in a landfill or the environment
- Plastic does not <u>biodegrade</u>; it fragments into tiny pieces called microplastics, then nanoplastics
- Microplastics are in our oceans, soil and air
- Scientists have found microplastics in our lungs, liver, digestive tract, and blood.
- We are all eating and breathing plastic.




## FOCUS ON WASTE REDUCTION & RECYCLING

### **ZERO WASTE LUNCH COURTS**

Zero waste lunch courts give students the opportunity to reduce, reuse, recycle, and compost (currently through the Café to Compost program) to take action on climate change each and every day.

Recycling lunch trays, paper "boats," milk cartons, juice boxes, and plastic and metal containers helps to reduce trash collection costs while contributing feedstock to make new products. This process uses less energy and reduces the need to extract new raw materials, which reduces the use of fossil fuels.



Students that bring lunch from home can incorporate reusable containers and utensils for a Zero Waste Lunch.

















## FOCUS ON WASTE REDUCTION & RECYCLING

### RECYCLE @ SCHOOL RESOURCES



Recyclables collected from classrooms and school offices need to make it to the large blue recycling dumpster outside. Sometimes the Building Services Supervisors (BSS), or high school Plant Operations Supervisors (POS), or their staff are able to do that, but often times they need help. At some schools student groups, such as Student Council, ASB, a Special Education class, or an Environmental Club are in charge of campus recycling. They do a great job of helping their school and the environment.

Involving students in recycling at school provides teaching and learning opportunities, not to mention valuable leadership skills.


